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

































Project Title: 'Folsom Clothing'

Visual identity and branding for a personal clothing range. Inspiration was taken from Johnny Cash's album classic 'Fulsom Prison'.




Collection of illustrated Victorian circus characters made cruelly famous by their unfortunate physical deformaties. The five illuminated boxes included each character and description of their lives.






Project Title: 'That's the way to do it'

A physical stand design and accompanying graphics were created that delved into the fascinating history and psychology of Punch and Judy.

















Project Title: 'Badass WW2 Heroes'

Collection of World War Two heroes that celebrated their bravery and achievements. Famous wartime animals were also included as part of the exhibition.











Project Title: 'Rebel Riders'

A series of seven three dimensional illustrations were created to celebrate the use of Harley Davidson's motorcycles in iconic American movies. Lighting was also incorporated into the work to create an appealing and atmospheric final presentation.







Project Title: 'Flycatcher'


A stand design inspired by Charles Darwin's journey of discovery on HMS Beagle. Outcomes included replica pages from Darwin's journals, and a collection of handmade fabric butterflies.







A range of print outcomes were produced for this project, which focused on the life of the Russian composer, Dmitri Shostakovich. A combination of traditional and digital techniques were used was used to connote Soviet-era graphics.









Project Title: 'Blood and Glory'

Students can also take the opportunity to turn a personal interest it into a design theme. This project concentrated on the creation of a gladiator themed board game, when information about related Roman characters would be gained during game play.



Project Title: 'Sio Pallaton'
